





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To establish a solid framework to regulate the international transfers of mitigation outcomes between Peru and Switzerland, while promoting sustainable development and guaranteeing environmental integrity. This framework will be consistent with the rules of the Paris Agreement and national regulations. of each Party.









Characteristics of the Agreement

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Paris Agreement

Framed in the Paris Agreement (principles of environmental integrity and transparency).



Joint work

Joint elaboration of both countries.



Modalities and procedures

Establishes the framework of rules and procedures to recognize the international ttrfer of mitigation outcomes



Transferor and receiver

Either party can be a Transferor (seller) or Receiver (buyer).



No comercial conditions

It does not establish commercial conditions or commitments to deliver mitigation outcomes.









Commitments assumed by both countries.



- Establish a procedure to authorize international transfers of mitigation outcomes within the framework of cooperative approaches in Article 6
- Recognize the international transfers of mitigation outcomes of the authorized activities provided they have met all the requirements established through the Bilateral Agreement
- Guarantee the non-occurrence of double counting of mitigation outcomes by more than one Party of the Bilateral Agreement. (corresponding adjustment)
- Have a Registry (database), which provides information on the participating projects and the accounting of their estimated, generated and transferred mitigation outcomes.
- Include information on the mitigation results transferred or received in the Biennial Transparency Reports.
- Regarding the validity of the Bilateral Agreement, it will be indefinite, however, both parties must remain a Party to the Paris Agreement for it to remain in force.





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Country specific sourcing procedures

Illustration of the operational steps in the cooperation between Peru and Switzerland under Article 6 of the Paris Agreement

Bilateral Consultation No Objection Validation Registration Governments review the Project Developer proposal and Transferring Government review the Project Governments publish, based on national procedures, project Selection of 3rd party Validation body (3Va)³ by the issue consistent recommendations to Project Developer Developer proposal in accordance with national specific Letters/Notifications of Authorization⁶ and submit Project Developer in view of facilitating consistent authorizations procedure1 and issue a No Objection Letter2. together with project documentation to the Paris Agreement, according to the provisions under bilateral agreement Project Developer provides Project Design Document (PDD) and supporting documentation to 3Va Project Owner engages in negotiations / concludes commercial agreement for transferal of mitigation outcomes 3Va evaluates project compliance with methodology/standard selected, consistent with the bilateral agreement provisions Project Developer prepares for operation according to methodology and conditions set out in Authorization Letters 3Va prepares Validation Report and submits Validation Report and PDD and modalities of communication to Governments review the project proposal and Validation Report to ensure compliance with authorization requirements (Governments could requests additional information to the 3Va4) Governments confirm compliance with authorization requirements through the issuance of project specific Letters of Authorization 5

Project Developer initiates the operation of the mitigation project



Project Developer monitors mitigation project and collects data / information



Project Developer prepares the Monitoring Report Project Developer chooses a 3rd party Verification body approved / to be approved by the Governments¹



Verification body prepares verification plan and prepares Verification Report and Opinion (certification)



Verification body delivers Verification Report and Opinion to Governments



Governments review the project documentation to ensure compliance with agreement provisions (Additional information could be requested by governments to the 3Verification body³)



Governments confirm compliance with agreement provisions and approve Verification Opinion. 2-3

Transferring Government registers the mitigation outcomes examined for transfer in its database, ensuring no double claiming of these emission reductions under another international system (cancellation under other systems, as necessary)



Transferring Government may issue confirmation to the Project Developer

Project Developer requests the Transferring Government to transfer mitigation outcomes (source, amount X, recipient)



Transferring Government transfers the mitigation outcomes (amount X) to the Acquiring country



Transferring Government registers the amount X of transferred mitigation outcomes as ITMOs in its database



Acquiring Government registers the amount X of transferred mitigation outcomes as ITMOs in its database and concludes the transfer by confirmation to the transferring Government on the receipt of the ITMOs (amount X)



Transferring Government informs the project participants on the conclusion of the transfer

Governments submit annual ITMOs report towards the Paris Agreement, consistent with CMA decision(s)



Governments submit biennial transparency report with adjusted GHG emissions levels (corresponding adjustment) consistent with CMA decision(s) and according to bilateral agreement









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
