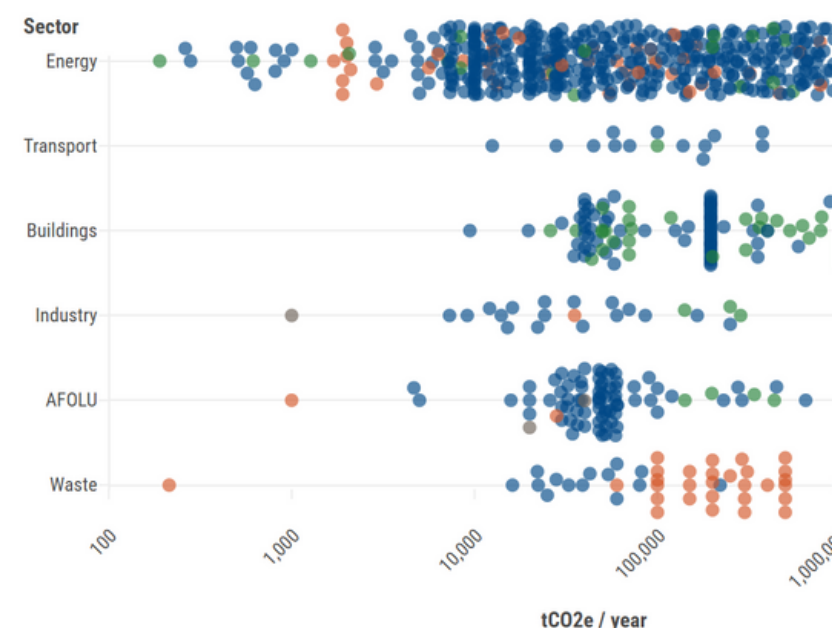
ESTIMATED MITIGATION POTENTIAL PER YEAR¹

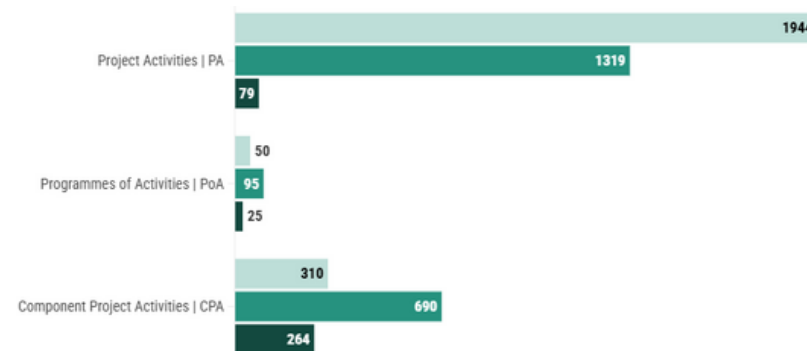

CDM Transition Requests

Activities that were registered under the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) and may join the new Paris Agreement Crediting Mechanism (PACM) under Article 6.4

Eligible (no request) Transition request Approved by host Party



4 transitioning activities

APPROVED BY THE HOST PARTIES



Chad approved the transition of a cookstove programme operating in multiple countries which had already received approval by the Dominican Republic and Uganda.

For another cookstove programme, **Togo** is the first of five West African countries to give its approval.

Oman and **Jordan** approved the transition of projects to recover gas from an oil field and a landfill, respectively.

NEWLY REGISTERED



Two wind farm projects in the **Dominican Republic**, and two water purification programmes in **Bangladesh** and **Uganda**.

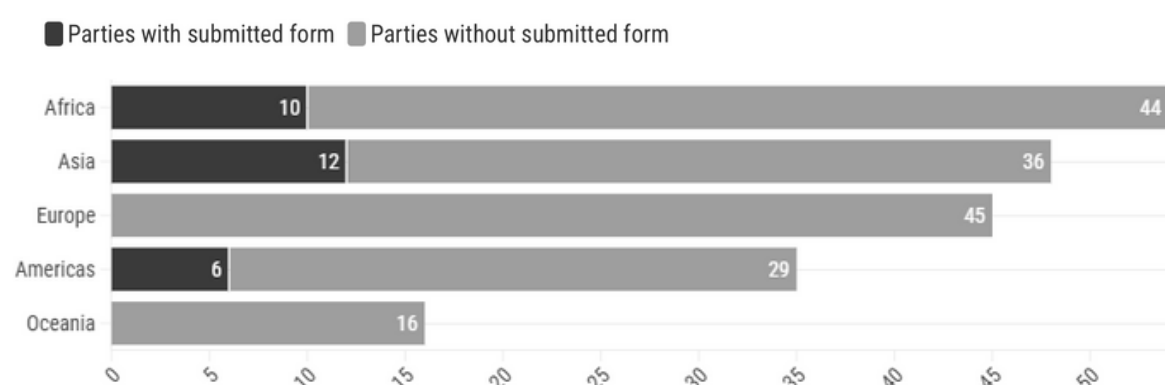

After the submissions by Burundi, Chad, Guatemala, Peru, and the Philippines, now 28 countries provided information on sustainable development impacts and the types of activities they may approve.

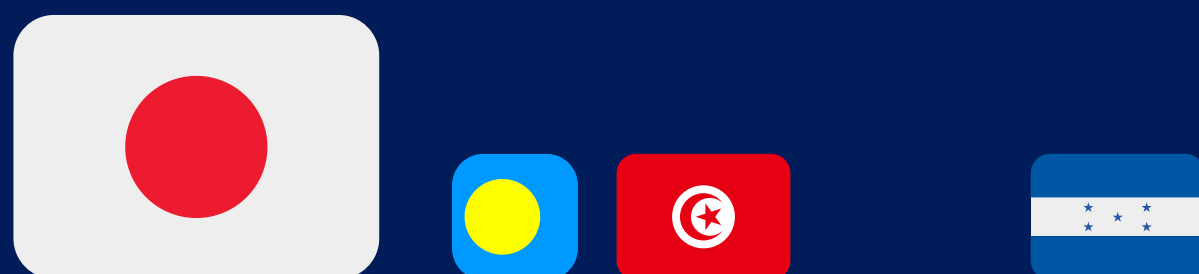

2 BILATERAL AGREEMENTS SIGNED



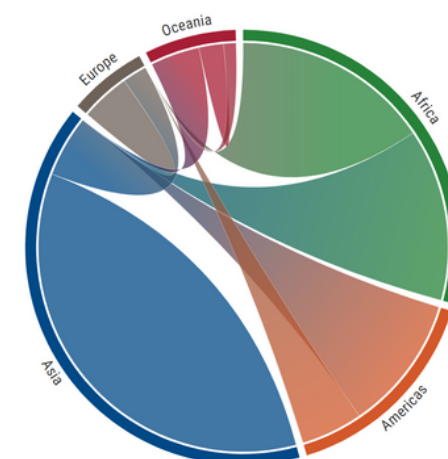
Singapore signed implementation agreements with Viet Nam and Mongolia after previously announcing their cooperations.

26 NEW COOPERATIVE APPROACHES



Mostly for cooperation under the Japanese Joint Crediting Mechanism - included in Initial Reports submitted by Japan, Palau, and Tunisia. Additionally, Honduras outlined a cooperative approach for REDD+ activities.

Number of agreements between countries by region (host and buyer)



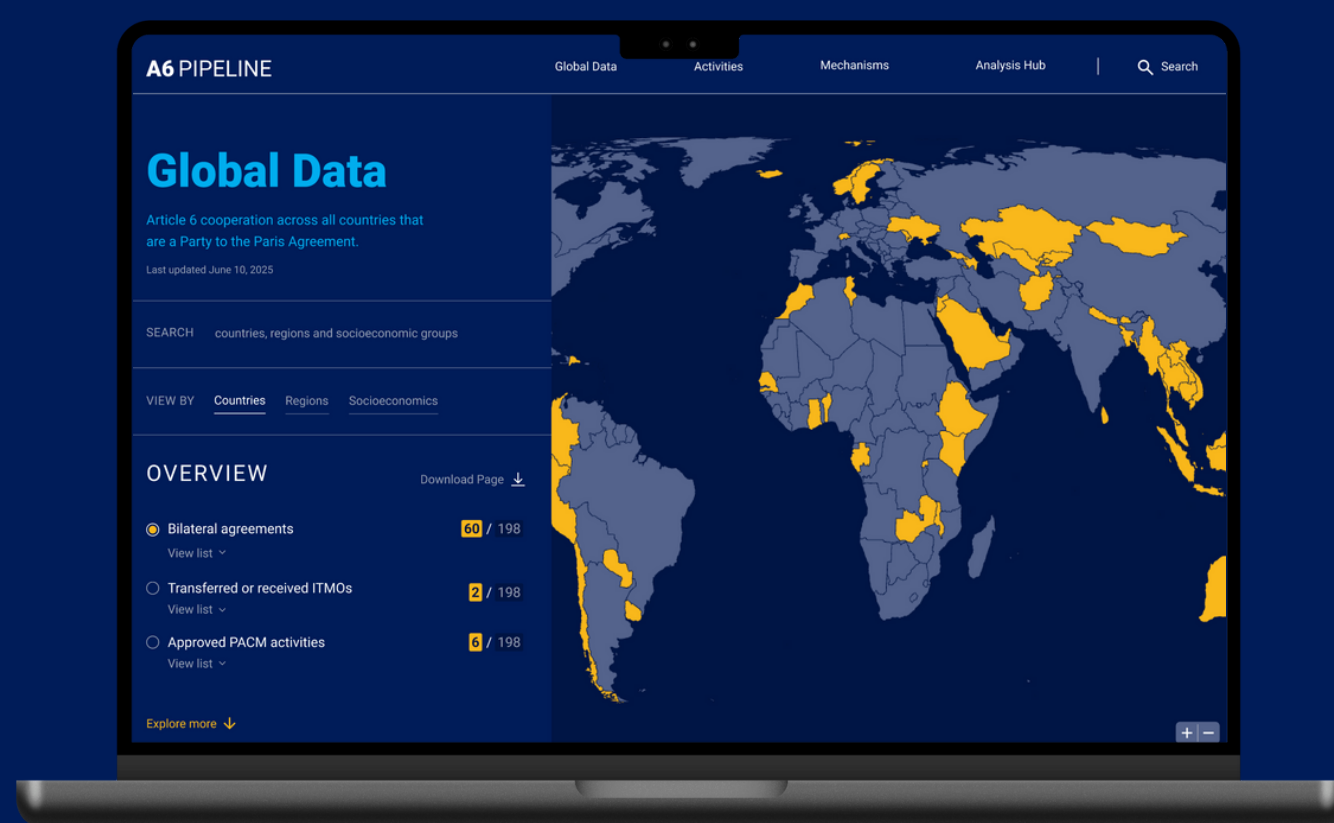
