



Chad approved the transition of a cookstove programme operating in multiple countries which had already received approval by the Dominican Republic and Uganda.

For another cookstove programme, **Togo** is the first of five West African countries to give its approval.

Oman and **Jordan** approved the transition of projects to recover gas from an oil field and a landfill, respectively.



WITH DESIGNATED NATIONAL AUTHORITY




Thailand appointed their DNA. Additionally, three countries updated the contact information of their national authority (Guatemala, Nigeria, and Uruguay)

Mostly for cooperation under the Japanese Joint Crediting Mechanism - included in Initial Reports submitted by Japan, Palau, and Tunisia. Additionally, Honduras outlined a cooperative approach for REDD+ activities.


